Directions to the Lighthouse

From the North:

- Take I-95 South to the SW 7th Street exit.
- At the bottom of the ramp, turn right onto SW 7th Street.
- Proceed to the next traffic light, which is SW 8th Avenue and turn right.
- Our parking lot is on the right-hand side, a 1/2 block down.

From the South:

- Take US 1 North until it becomes I-95 North.
- Take the SW 8th street exit.
- At the traffic light, go straight ahead to the next traffic light, which is SW 7th Street.
- Turn Left.
- Go to SW 8th Avenue (a traffic light) and turn Right.
- Our parking lot is on the right-hand side, a 1/2 block down.

From the West:

- Take the Palmetto to 836 East.
- Proceed to I-95 South.
- Take I-95 South to the SW 7th Street exit.
- At the bottom of the ramp, turn right onto SW 7th Street.
- Proceed to the next traffic light, which is SW 8th Avenue and turn Right.
- Our parking lot is on the right-hand side, a 1/2 block down.

From the West via SW 8th Street:

- Head east on SW 8th Street to SW 8th Avenue.
- Turn left onto SW 8th Avenue.
- Go 1 1/2 blocks north.
- Miami Lighthouse is on the right.

Engaging the Low Vision Community through Education, Research, and Service is a lively continuing education seminar intended

to empower healthcare professionals with the knowledge they require to meet the needs of the growing number of patients who are impacted by low vision. It will be held at the renowned Miami Lighthouse for the Blind & Visually Impaired. Presenters will cover low vision and blindness as they impact functioning and quality of life from birth through the adult years. Some of the topics to be discussed will include infant development, assistive technology, communication, psychosocial adjustment, patient/family-centered care, and independent living.

Target audience:

This workshop is relevant for occupational therapy and physical therapy practitioners, and nurses. Due to the increased prevalence of low vision in patients of all ages and in a variety of patient care settings, all health care professionals and practitioners can benefit from the information provided.

Objectives:

Upon completion of this seminar, the attendees will be able to:

- 1. Explain the meaning of low vision and its impact on function as well as know how to implement adaptations that enhance the functional independence for those affected by low vision.
- 2. Recognize the implications of early intervention and its impact in the areas of emotional, financial, and social well being as well as explain how visual impairment affects the different stages of development for a child.
- 3. Determine the risk factors impacting the mobility and safety of a person with low vision as well as learn how to implement functional mobility training techniques improving gait and balance.
- 4. Describe the adaptations and modifications to task that will increase the capacity for an individual with low vision to complete activities of daily living independently.
- 5. Know the skills necessary for visually impaired clients to complete IADLs with increased independence.
- 6. Recognize the difference between a regular eye exam and a low vision exam, recognize its importance, understand the definition and implications of legal blindness, including available resources.
- 7. Conceptualize the challenges of our changing demographics and their impact on vision loss.
- 8. Recommend resources for the care of elderly patients with low vision.
- 9. Relate recent research findings in the field of low vision to priorities in care.
- 10. Develop appropriate models of care to meet the growing demand of the elderly with vision loss.
