

# SAFETY PROTOCOLS

According to the American Optometric Association, one in four students has vision problems. If left untreated, these problems can contribute to poor school performance, behavior issues, and delinquency. Students with poor vision may not see the board properly or might struggle with close work. As a result, they may fall behind in class or act out.

Early intervention can help improve literacy and classroom performance. Students will be able to read their assignments, see the board, and achieve their full academic potential.





The Heiken Children's Vision Fund was created in 1992 by the Miami Dade Optometric Physicians Association in memory of Dr. Bruce Heiken who frequently provided free eye care to children. In 2007, the Board of the Bruce Heiken Memorial Fund and the Board of Miami Lighthouse for the Blind and Visually Impaired, Inc. agreed to a merger creating the Miami Lighthouse Heiken Children's Vision Program. In 2010, the Florida Heiken Children's Vision Program, LLC was formed as a division of Miami Lighthouse to provide free eye exams throughout the State of Florida. The program offers no-cost comprehensive eye examinations, with dilation, and prescription eyeglasses to eligible underserved school students. These services are currently provided statewide on our 5 mobile eye care units and a portable clinic to setup inside at school visits or via a voucher to one of our 1,150 participating in-office optometrists. Since its inception, the Florida Heiken Children's Vision Program has served over 191,000 students. With the statewide expansion, the program serves an average of 14,000-18,000 students annually throughout Florida depending on available funding. In a typical year, Florida Heiken mobile eye care units are scheduled for approximately 600 visits at schools and community events throughout the State.
