The specially designed clinic taught the history, basic skills, and rules of soccer. Our blind and visually impaired students tested their skills with a fun soccer match using soccer balls with rattlers inside which enabled them to locate the ball by sound.

Inter Miami CF human resources department also spent time with our teenagers, describing the numerous career possibilities within a professional sports team, giving our teenagers valuable lessons related to job readiness. Rotary International President Visits Miami Lighthouse

Miami Lighthouse was proud to welcome Rotary International President Jennifer Jones, the first woman to hold that most prestigious office in Rotary's 118-year history. This was one of the only planned visits President Jones will make in the United States this year. It was an honor to host this highly recognized worldwide leader and other Rotarians as they toured our campus. In the late 1920s, blind activist Dolly Gamble enlisted the Miami Rotary clubs to help the blind achieve independence and from their efforts, the Florida Association of Workers for the Blind was born, which would later be renamed Miami Lighthouse for the Blind.
