



MIA LAUNCHES AIRA SERVICE FOR THE VISION IMPAIRED

Mobile technology connects blind and low-vision travelers with trained professionals

WHAT: In recognition of Blindness Awareness Month, representatives from Miami International Airport (MIA), Aira, and the Miami Lighthouse for the Blind and Visually Impaired will host a press conference to announce MIA's addition to the Aira Airport Network - a free mobile service that allows blind or low-vision travelers to receive up-to-the-minute flight information, navigate security, use self-service kiosks, find restaurants and services, identify baggage, and more (video demonstration: <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=rXtv-M4WpMU>). A live demonstration will also be provided.

With just one tap of a button, Aira users connect with real, highly trained professionals who can see their surroundings through their mobile device's camera. The app is free to download from the Apple App and Google Play stores, and thanks to Aira Access, the service is free to use at MIA.
