- Of the approximately 8,000 charities evaluated each year by Charity Navigator, Miami Lighthouse is ranked among the top 1% in the nation and is the only nonprofit in Miami with nine consecutive 4-star ratings, the highest rating possible
- Accredited continuously since 1978 confirming best instructional practices
- Serving nearly 16,000 program participants annually, including 4,000 reached through community education and outreach, 33 times as many as in 2004
- Year-round programs for blind babies and schoolchildren, including pre-k in our new Lighthouse Learning Center for Children™, emphasizing Braille and technology literacy for academic success
- The Children's Trust recognized our Blind Babies Early Intervention Program as 2016 Children's Program of the Year chosen from hundreds of nominations throughout Miami-Dade County.
- Free eye exams and prescription glasses for low-income children, more than 111,000 exams since 1992
- Modern facility with professional music studio, computer and technology laboratories, training kitchens, arts and crafts studio with kiln, and beautiful tactile gardens

- Exams and vision enhancement strategies for seniors with age-related vision loss and vision aids to help maintain independence
