Miami April 23th, 2009— Community members are invited to attend the second annual “Music Under the Stars—A Taste of Brickell” on Wednesday, April 29<sup>th</sup> from 7-10 p.m. at the Miami Lighthouse, 601 SW 8<sup>th</sup> Avenue. The event will benefit the Miami Lighthouse Heiken Children’s Vision Program which provides free comprehensive eye examinations and glasses, if needed, to low-income Miami-Dade County public school students who fail state-mandated school vision screenings.

“This is a special evening to help raise awareness and financial support for the many thousands of low-income children in our community who need our help to see the blackboard in school,” said Virginia A. Jacko, President & CEO of Miami Lighthouse.

The Miami Lighthouse Heiken Children's Vision Program is the only entity in Florida with the experience, capacity, programming, and community provider support to ensure that every needy child in the public school system can receive a comprehensive eye examination and necessary eyeglasses—a truly remarkable achievement, given that Miami-Dade is the largest school system in Florida and the fourth-largest in the entire nation. This school year the Heiken Program will complete over 5,000 eye exams and prescribe more than 4,000 eyeglasses, but the need is greater. An additional 3,000 low-income children without health insurance or regular access to eye care may go without glasses this school year.

Founders Recognition Awards will be presented to three community leaders: Leonard Turkel, who was instrumental in acquiring the first Heiken mobile eye care unit, and Stephen Morris, O.D., F.A.A.O. and Sidney Stern, O.D., F.A.A.O. in recognition of the original Dade County Optometric Association founding board of directors of the Heiken Program.

Musical entertainment will feature Latin tenor Warren Tesh, guitarist Antonio Cobo, violinist Randolph Margitza, and internationally renowned pianist Julio Fumero, joined by the talented musicians of the Miami Lighthouse Music Program. Brickell area restaurants, including Tutto Pasta, Baja Fresh Mexican Grille, BLU Pizza & Cucina, Zuccherro, Badrutt’s, Gordon Biersch, 900 Novecento, Perricone’s Marketplace, Vin Brulee, and Blue Martini, will provide an array of savory delights.
